Trivia Night Fact Sheet

What is a Trivia Night? It's an informal, fun competition where teams battle to see who has the greatest knowledge of matters trivial. General knowledge and trivial interest questions are asked by a host. The winner is the team that, at the end of the night, has correctly answered the most questions.

When and where? Saturday, March 1, 6 p.m. in the KOG Activity Center.

Why would I give up my Saturday night TV to participate? *Lots of reasons...*

- Fun! Laugh, learn, socialize, eat, drink and be silly.
- Prizes! Door prizes throughout the evening and prizes to the top three teams.
- Bragging Rights! Tell family and friends you helped lead the winning team to victory!

How does it work? There are 10 rounds. During each round the host asks 10 questions, and each team (up to eight participants) records its answers on a score sheet. At the conclusion of each round the sheets are collected and scored by a team of judges. Correct answers are posted on overhead screens during the judging. Once the round has been scored, the sheets are returned to the teams and the scores are announced and posted on overhead screens. Cumulative scores are posted after each round. At the end of the tenth round, final scores will be tallied and winners announced.

Additional activities are planned for intervals when the judges are scoring the sheets.

What is a Mulligan? Mulligans are stickers that teams can use when they are stumped for an answer. A Mulligan is scored as a correct answer by the judges. Mulligans can be purchased before play begins and after the first round only. Teams can purchase one sticker for \$5 or three for \$10, with one purchase per team/table.

What prizes will be awarded? Bragging rights are obviously the most coveted, but prizes are awarded at the end play to the top three teams. A consolation prize goes to the team with the lowest score (should they be brave enough to come forward and accept it). Random door prizes will also be handed out throughout the night.

What level of knowledge is required? Questions are challenging and topics are diverse; however, winning teams typically answer an average of 80% correctly. Participants don't need to be versed in every category—it's the team's collective knowledge that counts.

How do I participate? Two ways. You can form your own team and reserve a table (limit eight to a table) or buy an individual ticket and play with a random group of other individual ticket holders. Table assignments of individual ticket holders will be made by the Trivia Night committee. Tickets are on sale each Sunday in the Atrium.

Beverages and snacks are provided with price of admission. Pizza will be sold by the slice.

How do I form a team? Look for a diverse group in age, interests and background. Questions and topics are varied—what one team member doesn't know, another might. You can also include "ringers"—people you know to be expert in certain areas. Tables made up of individual ticket holders will naturally have diversity in knowledge because of random assignments to these teams.

Who can participate? Adults and high school youth. Sorry, no children.

Is childcare provided? Childcare is provided, along with snacks, treats and beverages. Contact the church at (972) 661-9435
